

On Milt's magical journey through life he was able to make a dream of his father's come true when he created the Magic Castle in Hollywood; 20th Century Fox is producing a movie based on the Castle. This world renowned magician's club is now celebrating its 50th anniversary."


We Remember With Great Admiration
