# PPB Honors the King and Queen of Rose Parade Telecasts, Bob Eubanks & Stephanie Edwards

It was perfect timing for the Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters to honor **BOB EUBABNKS** and **STEPHANIE EDWARDS** last November as they were getting ready for their last Tournament of Roses Parade on New Year's Day, a gig they've had as a team at KTLA since 1982, with a only a few variations over the years.

But the wonderful tribute at the last PPB celebrity luncheon of the year was bittersweet because Bob Eubanks and Stephanie Edwards kept reminding everyone that January would be their last Rose Parade broadcast.

Eubanks (famed *Newlywed Game* host) assured that this was their decision: "Nobody asked us to leave. It's just time and we want to leave while we're on top." After over 30 years together Edwards agreed, and was both sentimental and sassy about her stories covering the Rose Parade with Bob. A very funny lady who was the original host of the national morning show *AM America* (forerunner to *Good Morning America*), Stephanie let it rip about "when we said 'now is the time to go,' Channel 5 began prepar-

Also on the dais were SAM RUBIN, DAVE HULL, TOM LaBONGE, ARNOLD SHAPIRO, PPB Chairman of the Board JEANNE DeVIVIER BROWN, and PPB President ALAN PERRIS, who presented the organization's prestigious ART GILMORE Career Achievement Award. The luncheon was filled with warmth and humor as everyone told fascinating stories about Bob and Stephanie.

Dave Hull, the legendary radio personality known as "The Hullabalooer," told the classic story about Eubanks bringing the Beatles to LA. "Bob did it all and attended to every detail for the 1964 Hollywood Bowl concert. He even made sure the Beatles had bottles of Dr. Pepper in their dressing rooms. That led to John commenting 'We're Dr. Pepper's lonely hearts club band,' which was the inspiration for their Sgt. Pepper's title album," claimed Hull, who was also on stage with Eubanks for that memorable concert.

Also telling tales was KTLA entertainment reporter Sam Rubin who praised Bob and Stephanie as "the real deal, drawing the audiences in with their broadcasts." Oscar and Emmy winning producer and director of *Scared Straight*, Arnold Shapiro revealed he's known Eubanks and have been friends "since working together on the Bob Eubanks Dance Party Show in 1961. He's seen a lot of entertainment history." Former L.A. city council member Tom LaBonge called Bob and Stephanie "part of this city's history."


Many former PPB presidents gave her praise. CHUCK STREET called Bianca "a truly extraordinary person."



And, he's busy working on a TV pilot. He says "It's a good thing, man. All is good."

In December, DIANE THOMPSON interviewed our own JIMMY WELDON when he was proclaimed "KNX Hero of

the Week." During WWII, he served in Patton's third Army batallion and was there for the liberation of Buchenwald Concentration Camp. Jimmy "just loves this country" and now spends all his time speaking in schools, to church groups and to veterans ... anybody who wants to hear about what he has to say about America. According to Diane, the best thing he does is a four minute presentation on the flag which he's given all over the country. His talks are about goal-setting and being of value to others. At 92, Jimmy is the last living voice of The Yogi Bear Show.

Past President CHUCK SOUTHCOTT's two-hour show Sinatra Centennial aired on the man's 100th birthday - December 12. Affiliate stations from Canada to Ohio, to Alabama and Maryland carried the show. Included in the program were rare interviews with VIC DAMONE and director GEORGE **SIDNEY** who told the story of how *The Lady is a Tramp* came to be used in the film version of Pal Joey. The show also included a telephone interview with FRANK SINATRA not heard since KGIL in L.A. aired it in 1972.

# HAPPY BIRTHDAY To Us -PPB Turns 50

The official formation of Pacific Pioneer Broadcasters took place on January 28, 1966 at a luncheon emceed by PAT BUTTRAM.

At first, 178 signed up for membership but soon, there were 534 who were declared Charter Members.

For the last 50 years, five luncheons, with a few exceptions, have been held each year to honor people who have made a significant contribution to radio, television or an allied field. Some of the exceptions were dinners when the Carbon Mike Award was presented to RALPH EDWARDS in 1967, EDGAR BERGEN in 1968, and JIM JORDAN in 1969.

**ART GILMORE** was the founding president of PPB and the award we present to each honoree bears his name. Art was 98 when he passed away in September of 2010.

Art began his long career in Seattle as a staff announcer at KOL. After moving to L.A., he was hired as a staff announcer at KFWB and soon went to work at CBS-owned KNX. During WWII, he served as an officer in the Navy in the Pacific.

After the war, Art became a radio announcer on shows like Amos 'n" Andy, Red Ryder and The Sears Radio Theater. Moving into TV in the 50's, he announced The George Gobel Show, The Red Skelton Show for 16 seasons, and all 156 episodes of Highway Patrol, among many others.

Moviegoers heard him on over 2,700 trailers, including those for It's a Wonderful Life, The Best Years of Our lives, Rear Window, Shane, Creature from the Black Lagoon, and the original Oceans 11. Among the odds and ends of a career that included narrating children's records and serving as national spokesman for Chrisler, he was the voice of President Franklin D. Roosevelt in the 1942 movie Yankee Doodle Dandy.

**JOHN HARLAN** says of his friend, "if there ever was a 'gentle man' it was Chairman of the Board Art Gilmore."

## **WE REMEMBER**

Former long-time PPBer JAY GERBER was a seasoned actor with countless film appearances. He served on boards and committees of SAG-AFTRA, the Credit Union and was an interim west coast representative for the Actors Fund of America.
