THERE HAS BEEN CONSIDERABLE INTEREST members to make available among а "baseball" type jacket featuring the PPB logo and the member's name. After considerable research, we have come up with the following options: We have selected a dark blue nylon jacket with snap closures, a ribbed collar, waist band and cuffs. The jacket can be ordered with the logo (an appliqué) on the right chest or with a larger logo across the back. Because the cost of the larger logo is determined by the number of stitches it requires, that option is more expensive. With the logo on the front, the cost of the jacket will be \$42 plus \$5 shipping and handling and tax, but including the name stitching. The back-logo model price will be \$65 plus tax and shipping and handling. Jackets are available in Small, Medium, Large, X-Large and 2X-Large.
