At the head table were Honorees BOB EU-BANKS, BILL HANDEL, WINK MARTINDALE, KERI TOM-BAZIAN, CHARLIE TUNA, MARK WALLENGREN and "SWEET DICK" WHITTINGTON. Representing PPB were President SAM LOVULLO, Entertainment Chair JEANNE DeVIVIER BROWN and program host and former President CHUCK SOUTHCOTT.

The afternoon was filled with anecdotes from radio luminaries, past and present. Keri Tombazian from KTWV The WAVE, remembered how difficult it was to go on the air the night of September 11, 2001; Mark Wallengren (KOST) was proud of the fact that he and Kim were the first man/woman team on radio; Bob Eubanks and Wink Martindale talked about getting into game shows following successful careers in radio; Bill Handel discussed the two programs he hosts at KFI and the ups and downs of giving legal advice on the radio; Charlie Tuna (KRTH) reminisced about his career - he's worked as morning drive personality for more stations and formats than anyone in LA radio history; and "Sweet Dick" Whittington proved to be as irascible and charming as ever. Chuck Southcott would like to thank Dick for making the four-hour drive from his home in Central California and adding "seasoning" to the event.

AT EACH LUNCHEON, WE HONOR MEMBERS who have made an important contribution to the development of broadcasting. In September, Second Vice President LARRY VANDERVEEN presented the Diamond Circle Award by saying (in part): "The term 'living legend' is often tossed around rather loosely. But not this afternoon, because we have one with us.

"His career began as MC for Canadian Army shows. In 1955, he went national with a five-year run on NBC radio's 'Monitor' program in New York. In 1960, CBS named him to host 'Video Village,' bringing him to Hollywood where he started selling his own show ideas. His first was aptly titled, 'Your First Impression,' on NBC, and his second was 'Let's Make a Deal' which remained on the air for a limited 22-year run - a remarkable total of 4,700 episodes. 'Deal' can currently be seen weekdays on CBS with host Wayne Brady.
